A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

2020 has been a year that none of us will ever forget. The COVID-19 pandemic changed our daily lives in a way that nothing else has in recent history. In the interest of public health, the library board made the difficult decision to close the library building to the public starting March 18, 2020, which was quickly followed by the statewide closure of all non-essential business on March 22nd. Even though the library doors may have closed, we did our best to keep library services "open" for our patrons in safe ways as the pandemic progressed.

I am extremely proud of our staff, who tackled the unknown territory of virtual programs head on, and held our first virtual story time within three days of the shutdown. We found creative ways to uphold our vision statement to help our community "connect, create, and discover" during a time when we could not be together in person. We continued offering our full schedule of programs and even added some new ones, such as Multicultural Mondays and STEM Saturdays. Book Club and Genealogy began to meet virtually, allowing our patrons to still connect and talk about books and research even though we were in our own homes. All staff continued working from home throughout the shutdown, creating and curating digital content, answering patron questions via phone and email, holding technology one-on-ones over the phone or via video call to help patrons set up ebook borrowing or access virtual services that they had never used before, completing webinars and training relevant to their positions, and more. We also moved our wifi router closer to the entrance of the building so that there would be stronger access in the parking lot for those who needed it.

In June, we were able to start working in the building again as part of the NY Forward Phase II reopening. There were many changes that needed to be made for COVID-19 safety protocols, including wearing masks (including some cloth reusable masks which were donated to us by patron Pam Opett, Moms Making Masks, and local business The Red Cardinal Barn), rearranging furniture and office equipment, cleaning procedures, daily health questionnaires, adding safety shields to the circulation desk, and more. We created a contactless pick up system so that patrons could safely pick up library materials that they had requested, and purchased more wireless hot spots for patrons to borrow. We later added in contactless printing, copies, and faxes to our services, and offered Take & Make kits for some of the crafts taught in our virtual programs. For the first time, we offered a virtual option to participate in Summer Reading, where patrons could earn points to redeem small prizes or raffle tickets for our grand prizes. We had participants of all age groups and were generously supported by the Friends of WSPL, the NYS Library, and local businesses including Mark's Pizzeria, Long Acre Farms, Tops Friendly Markets, and Wegmans. In October, we added in person services by appointment to allow patrons to browse and to use the computers, copier, and fax machine all while maintaining social distancing. Throughout the year, we did our best to keep library traditions alive, including Wear Your Pajamas to the Library Day, virtual Tie-Dye Friday, a Halloween photo parade with pick up treat bags, and a video message from Santa.

Although our construction project was delayed due to the NYS shutdown and COVID-19 restrictions, our board has been working tirelessly to continue making progress toward our goal. We are in the final stages of planning and approval before going out to bid, and hope to see our vision become a reality in 2021.

Lots of things have changed in 2020, but we feel that the library has risen to the challenge and continued to be there for our patrons during a difficult time. As we move forward into 2021, especially with vaccinations on the rise, we hope to continue moving back towards more in person services as safety allows. We have missed seeing our patrons every day, and can't wait until we can all be together again.
